
Year 3 have been working hard on their Celts projects for their new History topic.







Stars of the week




In Art this week, the children in Year




This week Nursery have been exploring the topic '3D Shapes'.

- used playdough to create their own 3D shapes.








Thank you to those who have already sent in boxes for 'Operation Christmas Child.
