Year 5 have been writing their own Macbeth inspired spooky spells.




Students have been enjoying their Drama lessons via Zoom with Mr McDowall and Mrs Ting

They wrote their own poems on what it would be like to live in a small cottage on top of a mountain.


Thank you to our students who provided home-made Welsh Cakes for this special day.
