Today would have been Canon Frank's 100th Wishing you all a lovely weekend. birthday and we have been remembering him in our class assemblies with prayers, poems and cards.


Our Governors met this week with the Curriculum and RE Committee and FPPC meeting remotely via Zoom on Wednesday evening.
