Year 6 have immersed themselves in their history topic of the First World War this week. They have written some heartfelt letters to loved ones in the role of a soldier on the Western Front and created some beautiful mesh poppies for Remembrance Day. Their sensitive approach to this difficult subject is to be commended.

# **Nursery**

This week Nursery have been looking at the topic 'Numbers'. The focus has been on numbers from 1-10, however this has also been extended from 1-20 too. The children participated in a range of activities to reinforce their understanding and their Mathematical vocabulary

- Counting the objects and colouring the correct amount.
- Introducing differentiated work, looking at the meaning of 'plus' and how to make your own short maths sentence.
- Listening to the story 'Clive the Bear' and discussing the structure of the story. As an extension, completing the 'cut and paste' numbers to match number and quantity.
- Using the interlocking maths cubes and prompt cards to create numbers.
   Extending this with measuring different heights of objects by counting the cubes and explaining how many cubes tall the object is. For example, water bottle, chair leg.
- Reinforcing turn taking and counting, playing the snakes and ladders game.



### Year 4



Year 4 have been working rigorously through examination technique and completing assessments.

Mrs Khan has been so impressed with their incredible focus and determination to learn!

In Humanities, they learnt to identify Key Amazonian animals and investigate the different characteristics of animal adaption.

Reception children created a beautiful Remembrance Wreath and showed it to the whole school at our 2 minute silence on Thursday.


### Year 3



Year 3 made some lovely poppies in Art as part of our Remembrance Day commemorations.


## Year 5
