Uniform reminders

A reminder that we return from half term in full winter uniform to include (all items compulsory):

Girls:

- School Blazer with badge
- Grey V neck pullover with school colour trim
- White blouse
- School tie
- Grey skirt stitched pleat school style only
- Grey socks school colour trim or grey tights
- Black leather school shoes (non fashion)
- Blue Felt School hat

Boys:

- School blazer with badge
- Grey V neck pullover with school colour trim
- White shirt School tie
- Grey shorts (long style worn all year)
- Grey socks school colour trim
- Black leather school shoes
- Blue Felt School Hat

Only gold or silver plain stud earrings are permitted in school and should be removed or covered for PE. Religious medals on a chain should be worn discreetly underneath clothing and should also be removed for PE. Sensible wrist watches are also permitted and again, should be removed for PE.

PE trainers should be plain white.

A reminder that figit toys/Rubix's Cubes etc. should not be brought into school. These can cause

distractions in class and should be left at home please.

Find a Shoebox

Get an empty medium sized shoebox, and wrap the box and lid separately in colourful wrapping paper or order preprinted shoeboxes online. Attach the boy/girl label to the top of your shoebox. Mark if your gift is for a boy or a girl and select an age category 2-4, 5-9 or 10-14.



Fill with gifts

Fill your shoebox with a selection of fun toys, hygiene items and school supplies. If possible, include one or two extra special items you know a child will love such as a doll, cuddly toy or deflated football with pump. See our Giff Suggestions below for more ideas.

Gift Suggestions

Toys: A football and pump, cuddly toys, dolls, toy cars, small musical instruments, yo-yos, skipping ropes, balls, small puzzles

School Supplies: Pens, pencils & sharpeners, crayons or felt pens, stamps & ink pad sets, writing pads or notebooks, solar calculators, colouring books etc.

Hygiene Items: Toothbrush, bars of wrapped soap, comb or hairbrush, flannel

Other Items: Hat, gloves, scarf, sunglasses, cap, socks, T-shirt, flip-flops, hair accessories, jewellery set, watch, wind-up torch DO NOT INCLUDE

Toothpaste, sweets, lotions and liquids; used or damaged items; war-related items; seeds, gum, chocolate or food items; religious or political literature; medicines, aerosol cans, sharp or fragile items.

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Make your project donation


