Nursery

This week was 'Story Week in Nursery and each day children have listened to a story and participated in a variety of activities to reinforce their knowledge. This included a discussion about each story, its structure and its characters. We have also been looking at the roles of authors and illustrators. Other activities included:

- Listening to the story 'Room on the Broom' and answering questions to reinforce understanding.
- Completing a Maths activity placing the characters from 'Room on the Broom' in the correct order of size from the smallest to the biggest. We extended our vocabulary using words such as big, large, medium sized, small and little.
- We enjoyed completing a science experiment and used prompt cards to introduce new vocabulary and questioning after reading 'The Ginger Bread Man'.
- Listening to the story 'Goldie Locks and the Three Bears' in Spanish.
- Listening to the story 'Jack and the Beanstalk' and following instructions to colour the correct
 amount of beans.
- Listening to the story 'The Three Little Pigs' and answering questions to reinforce our knowledge of the story. We then used a variety of materials to design our own house. Some of the things we discussed were; How could you make it stronger? Would the wolf be able to blow the house down?
