Details of the upcoming PTA Film Night were sent out on Tuesday. Mr Condon has full details of all the exciting PTA News in this week's newsletter.



Nursery

Nursery have been exploring spring this week. The children enjoyed viewing a PowerPoint and answering questions to reinforce their understanding. As an extension to this activity, the children used a variety of mark making tools and different coloured paints to create their own picture of spring. Other activities this week included:

- Looking at spring themed phase 2 initial sounds
- Exploring a small bunch of flowers using a magnifying glass.
- Completing a cutting and sticking activity, placing parts of a plant into the correct order and naming them.
- Planting our own Sunflower seeds.



Reception

This week, Reception Class has been enjoying our exciting new topic 'Dinosaurs'. Everyone had the opportunity to present their amazing Dinosaur Home-Learning Facts to the class and all enjoyed asking and answering questions about each other's work. We also opened our new Dinosaur Toy Shop and learned all about how to pay for our toys using money!

In Literacy, we have been discovering just how informative our dinosaur fact books are. We also enjoyed writing a list of the new dinosaur vocabulary we have been learning, while listening for the sounds in our words.

In Maths, we have been comparing weights using direct comparisons and using a rocker balance. We learned a new song about 'lighter' and 'heavier', and pretended to be a balance, showing our understanding that the heavier side goes down and the lighter side goes up.

We have begun our new science topic of 'Everyday Materials' with a class game. Children worked in teams and identified objects in the class and then labelled them with the correct material name. The rocks were quite tricky to find but some eagle eyed observations led us to them eventually!

Year 2



In Science we looked at what conditions a plant needs to grow and stay healthy.


We carried out a test and Mud was the overall planted cress seeds in winner in these very various conditions. We soggy matches! will now monitor these over the coming weeks.

Year 6 have been exploring 'financial risk' in their PSHE lessons this week.


