## Nursery

This week Nursery have been exploring the topic of 'measurement'. The children viewed a presentation 'Introducing Measures'. We then shared examples of measurements, reinforcing and introducing new mathematical language. We have also:

- Investigated 'Teddy's Towers' using the maths' cubes to measure from the shortest to the tallest.
- Explored the word 'capacity'.
- Investigated different sized containers in the water tray pouring water
- In small groups, we looked at full, half-full and empty.
- Investigated scales and different objects around the room, taking it in turns to measure them and discussing 'Heavy' and 'Light' as an extension, we completed a sticking activity to reinforce our understanding.

## Reception

This week we have been learning all about planting and growing. We planted our own sunflower seeds and cannot wait for them to start growing! In Literacy we have been reading Jasper's Beanstalk and can sympathise with Jasper who is also waiting for his beanstalk to grow! In Maths this week we have been working on doubling and halving. We drew ladybird pictures to help with our understanding of this. We have been making the most of the sunshine by visiting the garden to work on our fantastic observational drawings of plants and mini-beasts.



Over the last month, the children have observed their Sweet Pea seeds grow into a plant. They were very excited!
