Children's Mental Health Week

During Children's Mental Health Week we are delighted to launch our new teaching, learning and wellbeing hub—

the Laleham Lea Rainbow Room.

The 'Rainbow Room' supports teaching, learning and wellbeing for all Laleham Lea students across the school from Nursery to Year 6.

One-to-one and small group sessions, Emotional Literacy Support (ELSA) and Lego Therapy will all take place here with Mrs Bagnall and Mrs Hall our fully trained ELSA specialist, as well as providing an extra space for class teachers and teaching assistants if needed.

An ELSA is an Emotional Literacy Support Assistant. They work to support children and young people in a wide range of areas, such as mental health and processing emotions, helping them to reach their potential and cope with a variety of challenges.

Lego Therapy employs the use of three key roles 'Engineer', 'Builder' and 'Supplier' to build a model together using LEGO bricks. This is facilitated by a trained adult, although child led, to allow the children a means of developing their social communication skills.
