This week Nursery have been learning all about why it is important to recycle. The children enjoyed participating in a range of activities including:


- Singing the 'Recycling Song' whilst exploring a variety of musical instruments.

Year 4



These Year 5 have been going the extra mile to extend their own learning by tackling extra, individual projects at home including models, illustrations and even becoming a published author for the second time!


