This week's Prayer Bear custodian, stood up in assembly to read his beautiful prayer to the whole school. Well done!


Month of the Holy Rosary

Year 4



This week, Year 4 have been diving into the fascinating world of classification and discovery! The children have been learning all about Carl Linnaeus, the scientist who developed a clever system for naming and grouping living things. They were amazed to find out that his ideas from over 250 years ago are still used today to help scientists make sense of the natural world.

To bring this to life, the class explored identification keys – stepby-step guides that help us work out the names of plants and animals. Using real-life examples, the pupils practised asking "yes" or "no" questions to narrow down possibilities, just like

scientists do. Year 4 have truly shown themselves to be budding naturalists – just like Linnaeus himself!

Year 5 have been learning all about the British Empire and chose their own country to research.

On Monday, Year 6 enjoyed a fantastic visit from Transport for London. The children learned how to stay safe while using public transport, who to ask for help and using (and not
