Nursery

It has been a busy and exciting week for Nursery who have been focusing on stories. Each day this week, we have listened to a different story and participated in a variety of activities to reinforce our knowledge. Stories and activities included:

- 'Room on the Broom' answering questions to reinforce understanding. We also enjoyed pretending to create our own spells using our wands.
- 'The Ginger Bread Man' we enjoyed completing a science experiment, extending our vocabulary and questioning, using different props to re-enact the story.
- 'Goldie- Locks and the Three Bears' in Spanish.
- 'Jack and the Beanstalk' we followed instructions to colour the correct amount of beans.
- 'The Three Little Pigs' answering questions to reinforce our knowledge of the story. We also used a variety of materials to design our own house. How could we make it stronger? Would the wolf be able to blow the house down?

Rehearsals for our play Shine Star, Shine are well underway and roles have now been allocated - ready to be sent home this evening.


We also had a lot of fun seeing the snow fall on Wednesday!

Year 1

This week in RE, Year 1 children learnt about the different meaning of each candle during Advent. They labelled and coloured the Advent wreath in the correct colours.

Year 2 have enjoyed learning all about the great Fire of London and made these amazing collage pictures in Art this week.

Year 3

This week in Science Year 3 have been exploring different soils. They used their scientific enquiry skills to identify the characteristics of four different soil types to help them name and identify the type of soil. They then began to plan an experiment to find out which of the soils is the most absorbent. They began to think about variables and how we can carry out a comparative test.





Year 4

This week, Year 4 learned about Angel Gabriel's visit to Zechariah in the temple. To explore the story creatively, the children worked in pairs and chose different ways to retell the events:

Some wrote letters from Zechariah to Elizabeth, imagining his thoughts after meeting Gabriel. Some created illustrations of Angel Gabriel. Others wrote and performed play scripts, acting out the scene in the temple.

The class showed wonderful creativity and teamwork — well done, Year 4!

Year 5



Year 5 are enjoying their topic all about The Titanic and have produced some amazing posters in Art this week.

Year 6

Year 6 have been finding out about life in the trenches on the Western Front during WW1 and were particularly moved by the accounts of the Christmas Day truce. They have been writing letters home as if they were a soldier describing the events of that day. Their letters are up on display in our classroom.
