The Catholic life of the school





Year 3 have planned and carried out an investigation to find the most absorbent soil. They looked at what makes a fair test and selected the variables we would need to change for our experiment. The children carefully weighed out the soil and placed it into a filter. They then poured in a set amount of water. They measured how many millilitres of water passed through each sample to find the least and most absorbent types of soil. They then analysed their results and created a bar graph to record their findings. In our experiment we found peat to be the most absorbent.
