In our Celebration of the Word assembly on Monday we learnt about the true identity of Jesus through John the Baptist.


With the help of the Holy Spirit, we too can recognise Jesus as God and be witnesses for Him in the world.

"I have seen and have been borne to witness that this is the Son of God". (John 1:34)





Gospel Values

Nursery

This week Nursery have had a very busy week exploring opposites, activities included:

- Completing a cut and paste sorting activity
- Investigating floating and sinking—making a prediction before we carried out our activity, answering key questions and discussing our findings.
- Listening to the story 'Polar Opposites' by Eric Brooks, discussing about the story and giving example of opposites.
- Ordering the lengths of caterpillars from shortest to longest.



Reception

We have had an out-of-this-world week in Reception! Our learning has been centred around a Reception favourite, *Man on the Moon* by Simon Bartram. The children have been captivated by the illustrations and remain thoroughly convinced that they spotted aliens hiding on the lunar surface - despite what the story might say! I am sure they will be very eager to debate this with you at home.

To bring the space theme to life, we got creative making some fantastic, funny alien pictures. We also practiced our numbers by watching footage of a real rocket launch, joining in enthusiastically with the final countdown and a very loud "Blast off!"



Year 1

Year 1 have been busy with a few craft activities linked to their topics. They made beautiful flick books with Mrs Hall in Art and in RE, they updated the prayer tree with beautiful prayers of thanks and decorated their candles which they use for liturgy.

Year 2

This week our Year 2 students learnt about the Good News in RE. They have been designing an artistic interpretation of The feeding of the 5000. This involved cutting out pictures of fish and loaves of bread and creating an artistic design of this scene.



Year 3

This week, Year 3 dove deeper into our study of skeletons by investigating how joints and muscles work together to help us move.

The children learned to identify different types of joints specifically hinge and ball and socket and practiced spotting them on both humans and animals.




Year 4

Exploring Heaven Through Scripture. This week Year 4 pupils took part in a reflective RE lesson focused on what the Bible teaches about Heaven. The children explored and discussed the words of Jesus, including:

"My Father's house has many rooms... I am going there to prepare a place for you." (John 14:2).

Using this quote as a starting point, pupils shared their own ideas about what they imagine Heaven to be like — a place of peace, joy and closeness to God. They reflected on how we can live our lives in ways that please God, such as showing kindness, forgiveness and love to others.

The children also thoughtfully considered who they imagine will be with them in Heaven, expressing hopes of being reunited with loved ones and surrounded by God's care. It was a calm and meaningful session that encouraged faith-filled reflection and thoughtful discussion.

Taekwondo Student of the Year 2025


