- Played hide and seek with the Gruffalo


## Reception

This week our focus turned to the stars as we explored the heart-warming story of Beegu. The children fully immersed themselves in the story, using their fantastic performance skills to act out Beegu's adventures on Earth. This sparked some truly empathetic writing, with the children sharing wonderful ideas on how to comfort our lonely alien friend and make her feel welcome.

In Awe & Wonder, we reflected on our unique identities and God's love. We worked together to create a beautiful display for our prayer table, carefully writing our names on a large poster to celebrate that Jesus knows and loves every one of us. The celestial theme continued in Maths, where we have been mastering the concepts of "more than" and "fewer than." The children used topical glittery stars to compare groups, showing fantastic engagement and mathematical thinking.



## Year 1



As part of their topics on the Seasons and Weather, Year 1 enjoyed their "Raincloud in a Jar" experiment.

They made some predictions and then wrote their results down after learning that clouds hold water and become too heavy, eventually creating rain. There was lots of excitement and joy once the raindrops started falling.

This week in Art, Year 2 have been using clay to replicate shapes in 3D form and used tools to create texture of various fruits and used techniques to attach clay pieces.

## Year 4



Small Hands, Big Hearts! Raising Awareness for Vulnerable Children in Uganda.

Our Year 4 classroom has been transformed into a sea of colour and compassion. After researching the lives of children in Uganda and attending a special assembly, our pupils have created powerful awareness posters.

They applied the Catholic Social

Teaching of human dignity to emphasise that every child deserves respect, safety, and a childhood full of joy. They also put our class principle of distributive justice to action, advocating for a fairer world where the "common good" includes the needs of the most vulnerable.

"I didn't know that some children have to walk miles just to get to water. It made me realise that water is a gift from God and I am so lucky."

## Year 5

Year 5 enjoyed creating reflective posters during PSHE/RSE lessons this week for our fundraising initiative for Empowering Vulnerable Children in Uganda. They drew pictures and wrote well researched facts and slogans to support their engaging posters.



## Year 6

Year 6 participated in a carousel of activities focused on the principles of evolution and inheritance in Science week. The session explored Charles Darwin's work on how advantageous traits are passed to offspring to ensure species survival.

Students analysed specific adaptations in giant anteaters and dromedary camels, and compared the differing environmental pressures found on the rainforest floor versus the rainforest canopy. This study allowed students to see how specific physical traits enable species to thrive in highly specialised habitats.
