Nursery

In Nursery this week the children have been learning about transport, using a variety of junk modelling materials to create their own modes of transport and discussing how and where we could travel. The children listened to the story 'The School Bus Trip' and discussed the story and its characters, answering questions to reinforce their comprehension.

They then played the 'I spy' counting game and using a number line, identified how many different types of transport can be seen.



Reception

It has been a very busy week in Reception as we explored the concept of time. The children have thoroughly enjoyed learning to tell the time on the hour, and half past the hour, making their own clocks and playing interactive games to bring their new skills to life.

In our Awe & Wonder lesson, we were inspired by one of our pupils to delve into the bible story of Daniel and the Lions.

Peter Paul Rubens' masterpiece provoked deep thinking and some truly fascinating 'I wonder...' questions. We were particularly moved by one thoughtful suggestion that Daniel is looking toward the sky because that is where God and the angels live.



Year 1

With the arrival of Storm Chandra last week we decided to make our own rain gauge and measure how much water there will be after a week of rainfall. We made our predictions and then two students helped Mrs Khan and measured 8mls of rainfall in the rain gauge.



Year 2

This week our Year 2 students enjoyed a wonderful day out at The British Wildlife Centre on Thursday in Lingfield, learning all about small mammals and their habitats. They thoroughly enjoyed the experience.



Year 3

Our Year 3 mathematicians have been busy taking their learning beyond the desk this week! We've been exploring metres, centimetres, and millimetres by measuring objects all around the classroom.

The children had a fantastic time putting their skills to the test. The highlight was definitely working in pairs to measure each other's height! Through this hands-on fun, they've learned how to use rulers and metre sticks accurately and are starting to understand how different units of measurement work together.

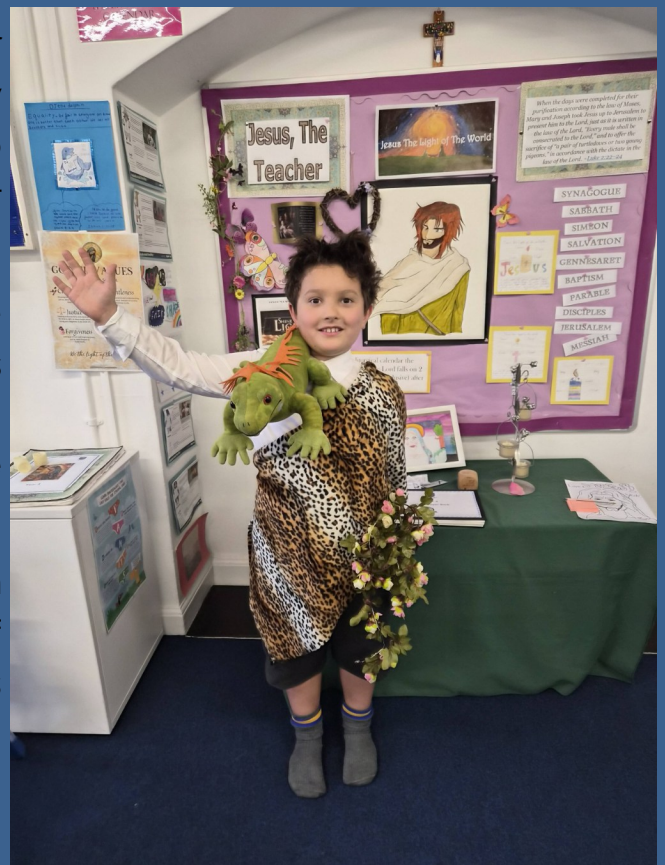


Year 4

This week, our Year 4 pupils swapped their school uniforms for camel hair (and a few creative substitutes!) as they stepped into the sandals of one of history's most important figures: John the Baptist.

As part of their RE, the students were tasked with imagining the inner thoughts of John, as he emerged from the Judean wilderness to announce the coming of the Messiah.

Each pupil wrote an original first-person monologue, focusing on the urgency of John's message and his humble role as the "voice crying out in the desert."



Year 5

A Collaborative Floor Book activity in RE

A Floor Book is a large-scale, shared diary of the class's spiritual and academic journey. This week the pupils focused on the life of Blessed Miguel Pro, a Jesuit priest who served in Mexico during a time of religious persecution.

The lesson encourages pupils to reflect on the concept of "God's Will" - not as a distant plan, but as a daily commitment to love and service, even when it is difficult. They reflected around the key question: "What are the qualities you see in Fr. Miguel that you would most like to see in yourself?"



Year 6

This week, our Year 6 students were introduced to the world of debating, exploring the topic: "Should homework be banned?". They constructed arguments, listened carefully to each other, and expressed their views confidently.
